This document provides a report of the achievements of the Friends of Carrington Moss between August 2020 and July 2021 and summarises the meetings, activities and events arranged, hosted and/or undertaken by the Friends of Carrington Moss Committee members. It also includes a financial report, completed by our Treasurer.

### Our Key Aims: Current Status

As in the previous almost 5 years now, and despite the difficulties we have faced this financial year, the FOCM Committee has worked hard to challenge Trafford's plans to construct 5,000 homes, 350,000 m<sup>2</sup> employment space and 4 major roads on and around Carrington Moss.

We continue to engage with other local groups and have worked extensively with the 3 impacted Parish Councils (Carrington, Partington and Warburton) and local groups such as Positive Partington, developing and enhancing our alternative proposals to the New Carrington Allocation. As an example, these groups jointly submitted a number of questions (on 8<sup>th</sup> March 2021) in relation to the Carrington Relief Road route options that were released in early 2021. We also requested a number of workshops to involve Parish Councils and community groups, such as ours. Sadly, we are still awaiting responses to our questions and our requests for workshops have been ignored.

It is clear that engagement with residents is not considered to be a priority. Trafford are certainly not following the Gunning Principles! The New Carrington Masterplan, for example, was not shared with community representatives prior to it being published as part of the Greater Manchester Spatial Framework. We were not invited to the table to provide inputs to its development, whereas Trafford's own documents confirm that they have engaged extensively with those that they consider to be major stakeholders (landowners and developers). It is certainly odd that they do not consider their own residents to be major stakeholders in this process, especially given the significant impact it will have on our lives, our health and wellbeing and that of our descendants as well.

Unlike Trafford, we have engaged extensively with residents in the communities surrounding Carrington Moss. We have held at least one online public meeting every month, inviting guest speakers to present relevant information to our communities. Andy Hankinson, from the North West Peatland Initiative, for example, shared advice and guidance about the restoration of peat mosses. Andy confirmed that peat mosses can be restored from a starting point of as little as 15cm of peat. Trafford confirms in their masterplan documents that Carrington Moss (the second largest peat moss in Greater Manchester) has peat depths of 3m (less at the perimeters). Restoration is clearly what should be the priority, especially given that declaration of a climate emergency and the importance of our wetlands to nature's recovery!

We also hosted an online survey, which has now been responded to by **830** residents. We asked whether the responder supports Trafford's plans for the area – only **4.2%** of those completing the survey support the plans. We asked whether the responder supports the aims of the Friends of Carrington Moss, to save our green belt for future generations of users, to support the climate emergency action plan and to improve irreplaceable habitats, encouraging the growth of bird and wildlife populations - **94%** of those responding confirmed their support for our aims.

Of those who support Trafford's plans, there were significant misunderstanding about the proposals. The brownfield land in Carrington, for example, already has planning permission. The New Carrington proposals are focused solely on the release of green belt, which comprises Grade 2 agricultural land, woodland, wetland and peat mossland. This land is essential for future generations to find out more, take a look at our blog, "[Understanding Sustainability](#)".

We also continue to promote the importance of Carrington Moss as a local heritage asset and a site of environmental importance. This is critical as Trafford has published a Carbon Neutral Action Plan (December 2020) which does not even mention that the Authority has, not one but, two peat mosses that could be restored to capture carbon and support the key aims of that initiative.

Despite the declaration of a climate emergency over three years ago (November 2018), Trafford has neither explored nor proposed sustainable passenger or freight transport solutions for the area. There are no trams and no trains (although there is a former railway line running right into Carrington and Partington). There are no water-based options (although the site is right next to the Manchester Ship Canal). There are no proposed additional bus services (we have checked this via a Freedom of Information Act Request).

During the year, we designed and ran another very successful workshop, aimed at informing and influencing the Carrington Master Plan, this one focused on Air Quality and Air Pollution. Whilst we invited landowners, Trafford Council representatives and subject matter experts, we remain disappointed that more effort is still not being made to involve community representatives, such as ourselves, at the earliest stages and throughout the planning process and decision-making, despite Trafford's Statement of Community Involvement. We have not been invited to attend any workshops arranged by others involved in the planning process.

We have also continued our campaign to increase the influence of the resident within the planning ecosystem. This year has seen our Chair, Marj Powner, not only become Vice Chair of the Save Greater Manchester Green Belts Group, but she has also been instrumental in establishing a national group, known as the Community Planning Alliance (CPA). The CPA now forms the umbrella organisation for over 550 community groups, all campaigning against inappropriate development in their areas. Marj Powner is their Vice Chair. The group provides advice and support to community campaigns, lobbies the Government for change, particularly to drive more community engagement in planning decisions.

The current status of achievement of our key aims can be summarised as follows:

### Key Achievements

This year has seen the Committee respond to a number of Government consultations, including the Planning White Paper. We have raised the profile of our campaign at a regional and national level through our engagement with Ministers and MPs.

In our collaboration with local Parish Councils and community groups, we have arranged meetings with HS2 to understand the impact of this national initiative on the local area (again, no information has been supplied to residents by Trafford or Transport for Greater Manchester, despite their engagement with the project team).

Our Alternative Transformation Strategy, setting out a different vision for the future of Carrington Moss, was created with support from the RSPB, Cheshire and Lancashire Wildlife Trusts, the Lancashire Peatland Initiative and Trafford Wildlife, local environmental and biodiversity experts. Trafford Wildlife have taken forward the initiative to expand willow tit habitats on Carrington Moss, which we identified as a key action in the strategy.

We have also worked extensively with local schools, engaging pupils in project work about, for example, sustainable employment in Carrington businesses. Our Earth Day Video was particularly well received by a number of schools.

In addition, we have:

- Continued monitoring air quality on and around Carrington Moss
- Published formal responses to various national, regional and local consultations
- Supported other local groups with their activities and actions
- Created various collateral, such as the videos you can find on our Youtube Channel
- Written 5 songs extolling the virtues of Carrington Moss
- Continued to raise awareness of the impact of the plans for Carrington Moss, including communicating with local people who are not connected to the internet:

- Raised funding to support our activities, see our Treasurer's report below.
